2. Rationalize the numerator in $\sqrt{x^2 + 1} - x$ $\frac{1}{\sqrt{x^2+1} + x}$

3. Find the line through $(1, -1)$ and $(-1, 1)$ $Y = -X$

4. Avg. rate of change of x^3 from $x = -1$ to $x = 1$ 1

5. Complete the square in $4x - x^2 =$ $4 - (x-2)^2$

6. Find x where $x - 2x^2$ attains its maximum value $\frac{1}{4}$
