Writing: Math 290 has been designated by the Math Department as a writing intensive course. There will be assignments in which writing will be assessed. In particular, you will be required to write clearly, using correct grammar and notation. Some assignments will require the use of word processors or typesetting programs (such as Word or TeX).

Make-up exams will be given only in the most unusual cases. If you must miss an exam, you will need to ask for a make-up exam no later than the morning

Homework. Homework will be assigned regularly, but will not always be collected. As with all writing assignments, homework must be written clearly using correct grammar and notation.
